On January 12, 1937 Julian Roscoe White was born to the late Phillip and Julia Louise White. His late aunt Adelaide White Banks gave him a nickname "Sugar Loaf"; later the word sugar was dropped and he became known as "Loafie".

FYI: As a child he didn't like having to wear shoes, this carried over into adult life. According to Loafie, he was the first man in Uniontown to wear a Mohawk "Mr. T Hair" style.

Loafie had a love for all animals including exotic animals, Boa Constrictor Snakes, alligators, goats, sheep, cows, chickens, pigs and turtles. He loved farming and flowers.

He served as Mail Clerk in the United States Army from 1955-1957; worked in the sugar cane fields of Florida; operated a flower shop in Uniontown and worked in the family's funeral business for many years.

He prided himself on being Phil White's boy. He was who he was. What you saw was what you got. Though most times outspoken he was bold enough to call things as he perceived them, whether correct or incorrect. He would help you if he thought the need was REAL.

As a boy he confessed Christ at the First Baptist Church of Uniontown. The God that he saw was evident in nature. He spoke of how God takes care of His own; grass for animals, animals for man.

2:30 a.m. Saturday October 8, 2011 at the Veteran's Hospital in Tuscaloosa, Alabama Julian Roscoe White entered into eternal transition.
